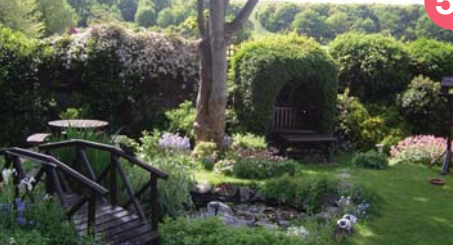

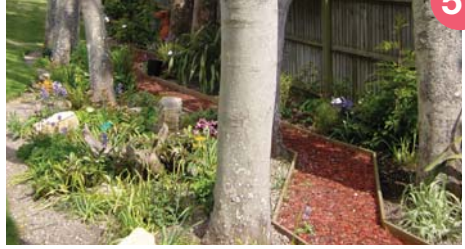


10 Wilkinson Close, BN2 7EG
